

CATARACTS

CATARACTS usually develop gradually with symptoms of dulling in vision, and/or problems with glare. Some remain small and do not affect vision, however if a cataract becomes larger or denser, it can be surgically removed. Cataract surgery is an elective surgery and generally a safe procedure and almost always successful. The procedure is done under local anesthetic and overnight hospitalization is not needed. Other common eye diseases in the aging are Glaucoma, and Retinal Disorders like macular degeneration, diabetic retinopathy, or retinal detachment.
